Position Qualifications: Excellent leadership skills required; experience with instructing and supervising rock climbing, guiding, and backpacking required; experience with children required. Prior supervision experience preferred. Must be 21+ with AMGA Single Pitch Instructor (SPI) certification, or equivalent, or ability to receive same before June 6th. Must have current Wilderness First Aid or Wilderness First Responder certification (WFA/WFR), current CPR certification, as well as a safe driving record. Experience with Jewish education, natural history, and environmental education a plus.
